

Subdivision of T. 10 N., R. 70 E.

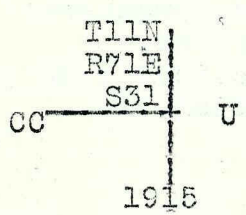
Chains

Dig pits, 30x24x12ins., crosswise on each line, E. and W., 4 ft., and N. of post, 8 ft. dist.; and raise a mound of earth, 5 ft. base, 2½ ft. high, N. of cor.
 Note: At 80.28 chs., fall 1.08 chs. N. of old std. cor. of Tps. 11 N., Rs. 70 and 71 E., which is a cedar post, 2x2ins., 1½ ft. long, greatly decayed but still standing in old mound of earth and marked as described by the Surveyor General, I destroy all witness points to this old std. cor. and bury the old cedar stake alongside the reestablished std. sec. cor. at 80 chs.
 Land, gently rolling with general drainage to N.E.; soil, sandy clay loam of medium texture, 26 ins. deep; no timber; medium sage brush, greasewood, shadscale and scattering grass; scant grazing, 80 chs.

RESURVEY OF SECOND STANDARD PARALLEL N., R. 71 EAST

East on resurvey of 2nd Standard Parallel N., through R. 71 E., along S. bdy. of sec. 31.
 Rolling land, medium sage brush, greasewood, shadscale and scattering grass.
 Intersect Nevada-Utah State line, 19.88 chs. N. of Mile Post No. 177 heretofore described. No traces of old Std. Closing Corner.
 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for Standard Closing Corner of sec. 31, T. 11 N., R. 71 E., with brass cap mkd.,



Dig pits, 30x24x12ins., crosswise on each line, N. and S., 4 ft. and W. of post 8 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 5 ft. base, 2½ ft. high, W. of cor.
 Land, rolling with slight drainage, to N.E.; soil, sandy clay loam of medium texture, 26 ins. deep; no timber; medium sage brush, greasewood, shadscale and scattering grass; very scant grazing, 38 chs.

 June 5, 1915: At 7h 58m a.m., l.m.t., I set off 38° 39' N. on the lat. arc; 22° 29½' N., on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., heretofore described.
 Thence I run
 N. 0° 01'E., bet. secs. 31 and 32.
 Rolling land, medium sage brush, shadscale, greasewood and scattering grass.
 Ascend gently.
 Top of ascent, 70 ft. above cor., bears N. W. and S.E.
 Descend into canyon.
 Enter scattering cedars and pinon pine, bears N. W. and S. E.
 Bottom of canyon, 30 ft. below point of descent, course S. E.
 Old wood road, bears N. W. and S. E.
