

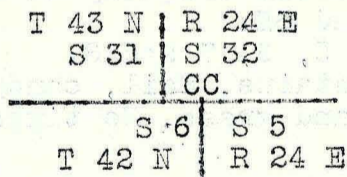

Dig pits, 18x18x12ins. E. and W. of post, 3 ft. dist. and raise a mound of earth $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high N. of cor.

52.40 Draw, course S. 30°E.
 64.20 Road, Summit Lake to Surprise Valley, bears NE. and SW.
 69.00 Road, D. Beebe ranch to F.V. Perry ranch, bears N. and S.
 70.00 Fence, bears N. and S.
 71.70 Irrigation ditch, 2 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course S. 15°E leave rolling mountainous land, enter flat meadow bears N. 15°W. and S. 15°E.
 75.30 Irrigation ditch, 2 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course S. 10°E leave meadow enter rolling mountainous land, bears N. 10°W. and S. 10°E.; ascend 25 ft. on SW. slope to corner.
 78.87 the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8.
 The W. 71 chs. and the E. 4 chs. of this mile are on rolling mountainous land with a soil, ranging from a fertile sandy loam to stony, and a good growth of sagebrush. The remainder is level meadow land with a fertile alluvial soil and a heavy growth of grass. No timber. Traveling at noon, therefore it was impossible to take observation for latitude.
 August 19, 1915.

August 18: From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8 I run N. 0° 4'W. bet. secs. 5 and 6. Over rolling mountainous land. Ascend 25 ft. on SW. slope to Closing Corner.

1.00 Road on Perry ranch, bears NW. and SE.
 1.90 Small corral bears W. 1.50 chs. distant.
 3.10 Stable bears W. 50 lks. distant.
 5.80 F.V. Perry's house bears W., 5 chs. distant.
 7.35 Fence, bears E. and W. about 10 chs. from each end, where it turns S.
 11.00 Road, Summit Lake to Surprise Valley, bears N. 65 W. and S. 65 E.
 11.77 Intersect the S. bdy. of T. 43 N., R. 24 E., at a point 13.79 chs. S. 85° 10'W. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on S. bdy. sec. 32 and at point of intersection set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for Closing Corner of secs. 5 and 6, with brass cap mkd.,

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high S. of corner.
 Land, rolling mountains. Soil, gravelly and stony. Fair growth of sagebrush and grass. No timber.
 Traveling at noon, therefore it was impossible to take observation for latitude.

August 18, 1915.
