GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

Almost the whole of this fractional township lies on the Black Rock Desert, though the northeast and southwest corners and the west boundary are in rolling hills. The northern part of the west boundary is really rough enough to be classed as mountainous. Near the ½ section corner between sections 25 and 30 is a low pass, through which passes the road connecting some of the Pacific Live Stock Co. ranches.

The soil of the rougher portions ranges from very rocky to gravelly and sandy. That of the desert portion is partly adobe and partly sandy. There is a fair growth of low sage and shadscale in the rougher parts and much greasewood, shadscale and rabbit brush on the desert. There is no timber.

Except for waste water from the Pacific Live Stock Co.'s "Clark's Field" and A. L. De Long's ranch, both in section 16, there is no water in the part of the town-

ship included in this survey.

The only improvements in the part of the township included in this survey consist of some fencing and the cultivation of some land in section 21.
