----- General Description -----

The eastern part of this township lies on the north extension of the Jackson range of mountains, which are very rough and rugged. The remainder of the township included in this survey lies on the Black Rock Desert. The surface of the desert land would be nearly level if it were not for the fact that the loose soil in many places has drifted into low sandy hummocks, which vary in height from 1 to 4 ft. The soil in the desert is generally a light brown clay loam with more or less alkali, and several patches of hard pan outcroppings. Bordering foothills have a light clay soil mixed with decomposing granites and granite rock which is the principal formation in the mountainous portion.

There is a fair growth of greasewood, shadscale and rabbit brush on the desert land, while sagebrush and bunch grass attain a good growth on the mountainous parts.

The mountainous portion of this township is considered excellent summer and early spring range, although on account of the steep rough nature of the mountains sheep are about the only live stock which can be successfully ranged.

There is a scattered growth of juniper timber in the southeast part of the township, which owing to its inaccessibility has very little commercial value.

Deer creek which flows through secs. 36, 35 and 27, furnished the water for irrigating the ranch of Wm Delong
