- No trees near for marking.  
 Gradual descent, no timber.  
 63.00 Telephone line from Dry Creek to Austin, bears S. 70° W.  
 and N. 70° E.  
 64.80 Road, bears N. 60° E. and S. 60° W.  
 65.83 Dry wash, course S.  
 73.00 Small dry wash, course S. 25° W.; gradual ascent along  
 rolling S. slope.  
 110.67 Top of small ridge, bears N. 60° E. and S. 60° W.; ascend.  
 125.15 Top of ridge, bears N. and S.; descend 75 ft. to the  
 closing cor.  
 134.00 Intersect the W. bdy. of the Tp., 20.27 chs. N. of the  
 cor. of secs. 13 and 24 of T. 19 N., R. 45 E. At the  
 point of intersection I build a cor. as follows:  
 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diameter, 14 ins.  
 in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, for  
 closing cor. of secs. 18 and 19, with brass cap marked;

 of cor.  
 Land, rolling, draining SW.  
 Soil, gravelly and stony, light, clay loam, coarse text-  
 ure; some loose and imbedded boulders and exposed ledges  
 on ridges and spurs.  
 Undergrowth, sagebrush and some grass.  
 Timber, scattered pinon pine and juniper on E. 40.00 chs.  
 Clouds obscure the sun at noon on this date and I am  
 unable to make an observation for latitude, with my Smith  
 Solar attachment.

- N. 0° 03' W. bet. secs. 17 and 18.  
 Over rolling land, gradual ascent, south slope, through  
 scattered pine timber and juniper also.  
 11.00 Gulch, course S. 30° W.; continue gradual ascent.  
 29.94 Telephone line from Austin to Dry Creek, bears N. 70° E.  
 and S. 70° W.  
 30.34 Road, bears E. and W.  
 30.74 Wood road, bears N. 60° E. and S. 60° W.  
 37.14 Gulch, course S. 50° W.  
 39.44 Old road from Smoky Valley to Grass Valley, bears N. 20°  
 E. and S. 30° W.  
 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diameter, 26 ins.  
 in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap marked:

- and raised a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high,  
 W. of cor.  
 A pinon pine, 7 ins. in diameter, bears S. 55° E., 14  
 lks. dist., marked:

¼ S 17 BT

No other large trees near for marking, therefore I do not  
 mark any; ¼ cor. on gradual S. slope 100 ft. above sec.
