
Chains

Dig pits, 18x18x12ins. in each sec. 5½ ft. dist. and raise a mound of earth 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high W. of cor. Land, nearly level valley sage plain.  
 Soil, loose sandy light brown clay loam, fine texture, about 12ins. deep, clay subsoil.  
 Undergrowth, sagebrush, white sage and scant growth grass.  
 No timber.

 July 29, 1915: At 9h. 00m., a.m., 1 mt., I set off 39°30' N. on the lat. arc; 18° 55' N. on the decl. arc and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30.  
 Thence I run  
 South bet. secs. 25 and 30.  
 Over slightly rolling valley sage plain.  
 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.,



dig pits, 18x18x12ins., N. and S. of post, 3 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 3½ ft. base 1½ ft. high W. of corner.  
 Gradually ascend.  
 Low rolling ridge, bears N. 70°E. and S. 70°W.; gradually descend.  
 Old road from Dry Creek to Willow Springs, bears N. 75°W. and S. 75°E.  
 Over nearly level land.  
 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, with brass cap mkd.,



dig pits, 18x18x12ins, in each sec. 5½ ft. dist. and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high W. of corner.  
 Land, slightly rolling valley sagebrush plain.  
 Soil, loose sandy light brown clay loam, 12 ins. deep, clay subsoil.  
 Undergrowth, sagebrush, some white sage and scant growth grass.  
 No timber.
