

Subdivisions of T. 20 N., R. 47 E.

Chains

Aug. 17, 1915: For solar on this date see line bet. secs. 3 and 17.  
 N. 0° 03' W. on a true line bet. secs. 5 and 6.  
 Over mountainous land, ascend along W. slope through dense pinon pine timber.

3.00 Top of spur, 30 ft. above sec. cor. bears NW. and SE. Descend.  
 6.00 Gulch 35 ft. below spur, course N. 50° W.; ascend.  
 27.45 Break in W. slope 40 ft. above gulch, descend N. W. slope.  
 36.25 Bottom of draw, 235 ft. below break in slope, course N. 80° W.; ascend 60 ft. to the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.  
 40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam. 20 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.;



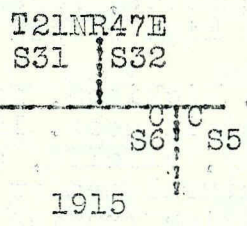
and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high W. of corner.

From which

A Juniper 14 ins. in diam., bears N. 29° 30' W. 25 lks. dist. mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$ S6BT

A Pinon Pine 12 ins. in diam., bears N. 11° E., 42 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$ S5BT

42.03 Top of rocky spur, 75 ft. above draw, projects W.; along W. slope through dense Pinon Pine timber.  
 56.70 Top of spur, projects W.; descend.  
 68.36 Ravine, 265 ft. below top of spur, course N. 50° W.; ascend  
 76.45 Top of spur, 75 ft. above ravine, projects N. 60° W.; descend N. slope through scattering timber 130 ft. to the closing corner.  
 79.75 Intersect the 4th Standard Parallel North 32.18 chs. E. of the Standard Corner of secs. 31 and 32 heretofore described. At the point of intersection I build a cor. as follows;  
 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for closing corner of secs. 5 and 6 with brass cap mkd.;



and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high S. of corner.

No large trees near for marking.

Land, steep W. slope of high wooded mountain, crossing numerous spurs projects W. from same.

Soil, very rocky, loose light clay loam, surface covered with large granite rocks, some exposed ledges of granite on spurs and steep slopes.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, service berry, some bunch grass  
 Timber, pinon pine and mountain mahogany, junipers.

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
