WEST BOUNDARY OF T. 22 N., R. 48 EAST

Surveyed by H.W. Reppert:

Nov. 22, 1915: At 8h 30m a.m., l.m.t., I set off $39^{\circ}44'N$. on the at. arc; $19^{\circ}57'S$. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of Tps.

22 N., Rs. 47 and 48 E., heretofore described.

Thence I run,

N. on a true line bet. secs. 31 and 36 on the W. bdy. of Tp.

Over rough, mountainous land; descend along NW. slope, through pinon pine timber.

20.00 Head of draw, 350 ft. below Tp. cor., course W.; ascend steep slope.

32.00 Top of high spur, 220 ft. above head of draw, projects W.; descend steep, rocky slope.

39.00 Bottom of gulch, 240 ft. below top of spur, course W.; ascend through pinon pine timber.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 14 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked:

A pinon pine, 8 ins. in dia., bears N. $88^{\circ}W$. 244 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 BT

A pinon pine 12 ins. in dia., bears N. $41^{\circ}E$. 36 lks. dist. marked: $\frac{1}{4}$ S 31 BT

44.00 Top of ridge, 180 ft. above gulch, bears E. and W.; descend.

52.00 Bottom of canyon, 170 ft. below top of ridge, course N. $60^{\circ}W$.; descend gradually, along W. slope.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 22 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, for cor. to secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, with brass cap marked:
