

12. Resurvey of West Boundary of T. 22 N., R. 48 E.

Chains
 9.50 Bottom of canyon, 110 ft. below sec. cor., wash in bottom of canyon, 12 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course N. 80°W.; ascend.
 22.10 Top of ridge, 200 ft. above canyon, bears N. 20°W. and S. 20°E.; descend through scattered pines.
 34.90 Bottom of canyon, with wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, 240 ft. below top of ridge, course N. 80°W.; ascend.
 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. to secs. 13 and 18, with brass cap marked:

and raised a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high W. of cor.

From which

A pinon pine, 20 ins. in dia., bears S. 70° 15' W. 33 lks. dist. marked: $\frac{1}{4}$ S 13 BT

A pinon pine, 7 ins. in dia., bears N. 83° 30' E. 34 lks. dist. marked: $\frac{1}{4}$ S 18 BT

48.60 Top of ridge, 180 ft. above canyon, bears E. and W.; descend through scattered pines and junipers.

59.80 Bottom of gulch, 170 ft. below top of ridge, course N. 30°W.; ascend.

66.00 Top of spur, projects W., 50 ft. above gulch, descend.

69.90 Bottom of ravine, 50 ft. below top of spur, course W.; ascend.

77.40 Top of ridge, 130 ft. above ravine, bears N. 70°E. and S. 70°W.; descend, 20 ft. to the sec. cor. along NW. slope.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. to secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, with brass cap marked:

No trees near for marking.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, loose, rocky light clay loam; loose and imbedded quartzite rock on surface; some exposed outcrops.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, service brush and some grass.

Timber, dense pinon pine on S. half mile; balance, scattering growth.

N. on a true line bet. secs. 7 and 12.

Over mountainous land, descend.

4.96 Top of spur projects N. 70°W.; descend.

12.80 Ravine, 4 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, 220 ft. below top of spur, course N. 70°W. 5.00 chs., thence S. 70°W.; ascend.

23.00 Top of ridge, 50 ft. above ravine, bears E. and W.; descend.

29.40 The old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 7 and 12, heretofore described. and hereafter referring to a cor. of sec. 12 of T. 22 N., R. 47 E. only. I establish a new cor. alongside the old cor. as follows:
