

14. North Boundary of T. 22 N., R. 48 E.

Chains

- N. $0^{\circ} 59' E.$ on a true line along the W. bdy. of sec. 6.
Over mountainous land, descend.
- 4.25 Wagon road in Underwood Canyon, bears N. $80^{\circ} W.$ and S. $80^{\circ} E.$
- 6.75 Wash in bottom of Underwood Canyon, 12 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, 30 ft. below the sec. cor., course S. $70^{\circ} W.$; ascend steep slope.
- 11.30 Top of spur, 130 ft. above bottom of Underwood Canyon, projects S. $60^{\circ} W.$; gradually descend along W. slope near W. base of mountains, bearing N. and S.
- 29.45 The proportionate distance bet. the cor. of secs. 1 and 12 and the cor. of Tps. 22 and 23 N., R. 47 E., for the reestablished $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 1.
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. for sec. 1, with brass cap marked:

- and raised a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.
- 29.60 Bottom of deep gulch, 200 ft. below top of spur, course W.; ascend steep slope 40 ft.
- 31.00 Descend gradually along edge of rolling hills, 250 ft. to the Tp. cor.
- 69.35 The old cor. of Tps. 22 and 23 N., Rs. 47 and 48 E., heretofore described. I reestablish this corner at the center of the mound of stone, as follows:
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of Ts. 22 and 23 N., R. 47 E., with brass cap marked:

and raised a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.
Land, mountainous, rolling W. slope.
Soil, loose, light, clay loam with quartzite rock imbedded and covering surface; exposed outcrops of same.
Undergrowth, scant growth of sagebrush and some bunch grass, service brush; some willows along bottom of Underwood Canyon.
No timber.

Oct. 26, 1915: At 8h 05m a.m., l.m.t., I set off $39^{\circ} 49' N.$ on the lat. arc; $12^{\circ} 11' S.$ on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of Tps. 22 and 23 N., Rs. 48 and 49 E., heretofore described. Knowing that the line on the N. Bdy. of this township will not close within limits,

I run

West on a true line bet. secs. 1 and 36

Over rolling land, sloping E.

- 15.00 Bottom of dry wash, 12 ft. below tp. cor., course N. $20^{\circ} E.$; ascend.

- 33.80 Top of spur, 120 ft. above sec. cor., bears N. $35^{\circ} E.$;
