Chains	Undergrowth, sage and service brush, and some grass. No timber. On account of not being on the meridian at noon, I am un- able to make an observation for latitude.
	West, on a true line bet. secs. 6 and 31. Over rolling west slope; descend.
1.80	Bottom of dry wash, course N. 10°E.; ascend.
6.30	Top of spur, projects N. 20°E.; descend along NW. slope, entering valley land.
40.00	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked: <div style="text-align: center;">S 31 $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 1915</div>
	and raised a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.
67.24	Intersect N. and S. line, 14.08 chs. N. of the cor. of Ts. 22 and 23 N., R. 47 E., heretofore described. SUBDIVISIONS OF T. 22 N., R. 48 E.

	Surveyed by W. R. Johnston. Oct. 16, 1915: At 9h 00m., a.m., l.m.t., I set off 39° 44'N. on the latitude arc, 8°38'S. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the S. bdy. of the Tp. Whence, Pieretti's house bears N. 49° 43'E. Pieretti's barn bears N. 48°E. SE. corner of Pieretti's fence bears N. 79° 43' E. Thence I run N. bet. secs. 35 and 36. Over rolling land, sloping E.; gradual descent.
20.00	Dry wash, 45 ft. below sec. cor., course N. 85°E.; ascend 100 ft. to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
40.00	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 14 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked: <div style="text-align: center;">S 35 $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 1915</div>
	and raised a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W.
