GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

T. 6 N., R. 67 E. is located about 30 miles due North of Pioche, Nev., on the East edge of Duck or called locally Lake Valley, and borders on the West foot hills of the Cedar Range of Mountains.

With the exception of the extreme eastern portion where some rolling hills are found, the general character of the land is rolling with drainage to the NW. and W. The soil throughout the Tp., in general is a fine brown gravel on surface, 1 to 2 ins. deep on a subsoil of stiff gravelly sandy white clay of medium texture. Generally speaking, the Tp. is barren of timber although along the S. boundary is found a medium growth of scrub cedars and pinon pine and along the East bdy., a scant growth of scrub cedars and pinon pine. A medium undergrowth of black sage brush, from 1 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. tall along with scattering greasewood and grass is found throughout the Tp. and grazing facilities found to be scant.
