

## 10. Retracement of portion of P.L.I.R. Boundary

Chains

May 5, 1916: For solar on this date see retracement of line between secs. 8 and 9 of the subdivisions of T. 20 N., R. 24 E.

From the  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile cor. on the Reservation boundary, which is a 1 in. iron post set 24 ins. in the ground for P.L.I.R. Cor., with brass cap mkd.,

I run, S.  $47^{\circ} 50' E.$  on retracement of the P. L. I. R. boundary.

36.70 The closing cor. of secs. 9 and 16, which is a 1 in. iron post, set in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

39.46 Intersect the 2 M. corner on the Reservation boundary, which is a 1 in. iron post set in a mound of stone marked

I run N.  $27^{\circ} 46' E.$  on retracement.

12.69 Intersect the closing corner of secs. 9 and 16, which is a granite  $12 \times 14 \times 10$  ins. above ground firmly set, marked C C on E. and P. L. I. R. on W. This cor. has been re-marked with a 1 in. iron post set in a mound of stone alongside the stone cor. with brass cap mkd.,

35.44 Intersect the closing corner of secs. 9 and 10 set from within the Reservation, which is a 1 in. iron post set 24 ins. in the ground, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

39.78 The 3 M cor. of the P. L. I. R. which is a 1 in. iron post heretofore described.
