

Retracement and Resurvey of the
West Boundary of T.11 N., R.68 E.

Chains

heretofore described.

I destroy all marks on this old Tp. cor. post which pertains to R. 68 E. and reestablish same in its original position as follows:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of Tps. 11 and 12 N., R.67 E., with brass cap marked

Dig pits, 30x24x12 ins., on each line, N. and S., 4 ft., and W. of post, 8 ft. dist.; and bury the old Tp. cor. post alongside of iron post.

Land, gently rolling; general drainage, to the W.; soil, medium coarse brown and white gravel on surface, 1 to 2 ins. deep; subsoil, hard sandy clay loam mixed with some gravel; no timber; medium undergrowth of sage brush and scattering greasewood, shadscale and grass; scant grazing on 60.10 chs.; alfalfa field, 19.90 chs.

Resurvey of a portion of the Second
Standard Parallel North, through Range 68 East.

From the standard cor. of Tps. 11 N., Rs. 67 and 68 E., heretofore described, I resurvey East, along the Second Standard Parallel North and S. bdy. of sec. 31.

Over gently rolling land, through medium undergrowth of sage brush, shadscale, greasewood and scattering grass.

9.80 Dry irrigation ditch, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains N.35°W.

No difference between measurements of 40.00 chs., by two sets of chainmen.

40.00 Unable to find any traces of standard 1/4 sec. cor.
