Second Standard Parallel North, through Range 68 East.

No suitable bearing trees available.

Dig pits, 24x18x12 ins., crosswise on each line, E. and W., 3 ft., and N. of post, 7 ft. dist.

This cor. stands at the foot of the W. slope of the Snake Range of mountains, about 200 ft. above the standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

Land, rolling; general drainage, to the west and southwest; soil, brown gravelly loam of medium texture with some scattering loose lime rock on surface; no timber on W. 67 $\frac{1}{2}$  chs.; scattering growth of scrub cedars on E. 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  chs.; medium undergrowth of sage brush, greasewood, shadscale and scattering grass; scant grazing, 80 chs.

Note: On account of steep and impassable limestone and quartzite ledges E. and NE. of this cor., I abandon resurvey of this line at this point.

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A portion of the North Boundary of T.11 N., R.68 E.

Knowing that a closing Tp. cor. will be necessary at a point where the N. bdy. intersects the W. bdy. of the Tp., I proceed as follows:

From the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., herein and after described, I survey West, on a true line, bet. secs. 5 and 32.

Over rolling land, through scattering growth of cedars and pinon pine and medium undergrowth of sage brush, greasewood and scattering rabbit brush, shadscale and grass.

Descend gradually.

- 3.05 Dry wash, 25 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains S.55°W.
- 19.60 Dry wash, 30 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, drains S.65°W.
- 20.00 Leave scattering growth of timber, bears N. and S.
