

10. Retracement of 3rd Standard Parallel N., R. 38 East.

S. of tangent 88 lks. dist., is the S.C. of secs. 34 and 35, which I find to be a tree cor., a pinon pine, 20 ins. in diam., mkd. T15N S2 on SE., R38E S3 on SW., T15N S34 on NW., and S35 on NE. sides, from which two old bearing trees, a Pine, bears N. 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 44 lks., dist. and a pinon pine, 11 ins. diam. bears S. 61° E., 70 lks. dist., properly marked.
Note: This cor. was reported as a stone corner, with NE. and NW. bearing trees.
True course of this mile is S. 89° 40' W.

S. 89° 59' W. on the tangent from my station 88 lks. N. of cor., retracing along S. bdy. of sec. 34.
No trace of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., after a careful search.
S. of the tangent, 30 lks. dist., is the old S.C. of secs. 33 and 34, which is a greatly decayed post, 3 ins. square, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, properly marked, unwitnessed.
True course of this mile is N. 89° 34' W.

S. 89° 58' W., on the tangent from my station 30 lks. N. of the cor., retracing along S. bdy. of sec. 33.
After a careful and extended search, no trace of the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner could be found.

N. of the tangent, 29 lks. dist., is the old S.C. of secs. 32 and 33, which I find to be a cedar tree, 8 ins. in diam., properly marked, on four sides, unwitnessed.
This corner was reported as a stone cor., with 2 bearing trees.
True course of this mile is N. 89° 38' W.

S. 89° 57' W. on the tangent from my station 29 lks. S. of corner, retracing along S. bdy. of sec. 32.
After a careful search, no trace of $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. could be found.
N. of the tangent, 14 lks. dist. is the old S.C. of secs. 31 and 32, which I find to be a dead pinon pine tree, 8 ins. in diam., lying on the ground, marked with T14N S5, S6 T15N S31, R38E., SC., and S32 on four sides, unwitnessed.
Note: Cor. was reported as a stone corner with 2 bearing trees.
True course of this mile is S. 89° 51' W.

S. 89° 56' W. on the tang., from my station 14 lks. S. of cor., retracing along S. bdy. of sec. 31.
After a careful search, no trace of the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. could be found.

Fall 1 lk. N. of the S.C. of T. 16 N., Rs. 37 and 38 E., which I find to be a dead pinon pine tree, 7 ins. in diam. lying on the ground, marked with 6 notches on 3 edges, T14N R37E S1, T15N SC S31, R38E., no other marks visible, unwitnessed.
This cor. was reported as a stone cor., with 2 bearing trees. The course of this mile is S. 89° 50' W.
Careful searches were made along the entire line for the Closing Corners as reported set on this standard, but failed to find any trace of said cors.
