## GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This township contains rolling and rough mountainous and gently rolling valley land, It is situated in the Desatoya Mt. Range, having a northerly and southerly trend, rising to an elevation of approximately 2000 ft. above the valley. It is covered with considerable growth of scrub pinon pine and cedar, with some mahogany timber, occuring in clumps and patches. Valuable for fuel and posts.

The soil in the mountainous portions, ranges from rocky of limestone, porphyry and volcanic formations to gravelly, mixed with dark, rich, mountain loam; can be classed at from 4th to 2nd rate. Is covered with a heavy growth of black sage brush and grasses.

The Tp. is watered by Campbell Creek; a small stream of pure water, having a general south-easterly course, entering the Tp. in sec. 4, flowing to sec. 24, where it is used for irrigating purposes; and by a small stream heading in sec. 20, and flows W.; also several small springs.

The old Mining Camp of Carroll, is located in secs. 8 and 9; the main shaft being near the  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. of secs. 8 and 9 in sec. 8.

Campbell Ranch, claimed by O.J. Heath, is located in the N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of sec. 24. Improvements consist of 3 good stone houses, barn, corral, fences and approximately 60 acres under cultivation.

John Buzan a settler is living in the W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of sec. 34, improvements consist of a good log house, barn, fences and approximately 20 acres under cultivation.

The Tp. is well adapted for grazing, for which purpose it is being principally used.
