

Retracement and Resurvey of the
First Standard Parallel North through Range 56 East.

chains

Dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., E. and W. of post, 3 ft. dist.; and bury the old standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. alongside of iron post.

From this reestablished standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., just described, I resurvey

S. 89° 36' E., continuing along the S. bdy. of sec. 34.

50.55 Dry wash, 12 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, drains NW.

71.20 Dry wash, 20 lks. wide, 4 ft. deep, drains NW.

80.81 Intersect the standard cor. of secs. 34 and 35.

As this old standard sec. cor. is somewhat decayed and obliterated, I reestablish same in exact position as follows:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for standard cor. of secs. 34 and 35, with brass cap marked

Dig pits, 24x18x12 ins., crosswise on each line, E. and W., 3 ft., and N. of post, 7 ft. dist.; and bury old standard sec. cor. alongside of iron post.

Land, gently rolling with slight general drainage to the NW.; soil, brown sandy clay loam of soft texture mixed with some black and white alkali, 26' ins. deep; no timber; medium undergrowth of greasewood and shadscale and scattering sage brush and grass; good grazing on the mile.

Retracement and Resurvey of the
Ruby Valley Guide Meridian, through Tps. 5 N., between
Rs. 55 and 56 E.

I begin at the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 31 and 36, which, although no traces of the old wooden stake are found, is identified by very plain traces of old pits and mound of
