

## Subdivisions of T. 46 N., R. 30 E.

This  $\frac{1}{2}$  cor. is on top of an outcropping ledge of solid ledge of rock, 8 ft. base and 6 ft. high. Impossible to erect a mound of stone.

- 46.70 Top of ridge, 690 ft. above bottom of gulch, bears N. 60° W. and S. 60° E.; descend NE. slope.
- 50.00 Bottom of depression bet. ridge and spur, drains NE.; asc.
- 59.80 Top of spur, 50 ft. above bottom of depression, bears N. 70° E. and S. 70° W.; descend.
- 67.15 Head of gulch, 190 ft. below top of spur, course N. 70° E.; asc.
- 71.30 Top of spur, 20 ft. above head of gulch, projects N. 60° E.; descend.
- 76.00 Bottom of gulch, 180 ft. below top of spur, course N. 40° E.; along rolling E. slope to the closing cor.
- 86.97 Intersect a point on the N. bdy. of the Tp., 8.22 chs. W. of the cor. of secs. 31 and 32 of T. 47 N., R. 30 E., heretofore described. At the point of intersection I build a cor. as follows:
- Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for the closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6, with brass cap mkd.
