


Metes and Bounds Surveys in T. 47 N., R. 30 E.

Chains and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high,  
 W. of cor.  
 Ascend 1000 ft. to the closing cor. on state boundary.  
 54.60 Ascend more gradual slope.  
 74.40 Ascend gradually along E. slope.  
 101.88 Intersect Oregon-Nevada State Boundary at a point 12.68  
 chs., S. 89° 58' W. of the 237 M 20.00 chs. monument on  
 the Nevada- Oregon State Boundary heretofore described.  
 At the point of intersection I build a cor. as follows:  
 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the  
 ground for the closing cor. of Tps. 47 N., Rs. 29 and  
 30 E., with brass cap mkd.

Land, mountainous, steep ascent along E. and SE. slopes,  
general exposure to the E. and SE.

Soil, very rocky clay loam, shallow, loose and imbedded  
rocks and boulders on surface, some exposed mineralized  
ledges of quartz.

Undergrowth, sagebrush and fair growth bunch grass.  
**No timber.**
