An aspen, 6 ins. diam., bears N.83°45'W., 2.81 chs. dist., marked T 47 N R57 E S 35 B T.  
 No other trees available, raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.  
 This sec. cor. is in the head of a draw, 150 ft. below spur, course NE.  
 Land, rolling mountainous with general drainage to the NE.  
 Soil, rich, light loam 2 ft. deep in draws; more shallow and rocky on ridges and spurs.
