43.05 Road, bears S 60°E and N 60°W

43.50 Creek, 6 lks. wide, 4 ins. deep, flows N 60°W. Asc. rocky
S.W. slope, through fairly thick juniper trees.

63.50 Large spur, slopes S.W., 240 ft. above creek. Desc. N.W.
slope.

78.10 Deep ravine, course S 55°W, 210 ft. below spur. Asc.
S.E. slope.

83.17 50 ft. above ravine.

Intersect the S. bdy. of sec. 30 at W. 3.00 chs. from the
cor. of secs. 29 and 30.

Set a volcanic rock, 32 x 12 x 10 ins., 21 ins. in the
ground for cor. of secs. 31 and 32, mkd. with 1 notch on
W., 5 notches on E., and 1 notch on S. edge.

Raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.

A juniper tree 7 ins. dia., bears S 75°10'E, 31 lks. dist.
mkd. T 24 N R 18 E S 32 B T

A juniper tree 10 ins. dia. bears S 29°W, 92 lks. dist.
mkd. T 24 N R 18 E S 31 B T

Land, high, rocky, mountains of granite and volcanic rocks.

Soil, dry, gravelly and rocky. 3rd. and 4th. rate. Fair
feed of sagebrush, with some grass and weeds. Scattering
juniper trees on the N. 39.67 chs.

Begin at the closing cor. of Tps. 23 and 24 N, R 18 E
on the State Line.

N 0°33'E, on a true line, on the W. bdy. of sec. 31,
which is also the State Line.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 24 ins. in the
ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 31, with brass cap mkd.
