General Description.

The eastern, southern and western portions of this township, are level or rolling, except for a range of mountains running in a northerly and southerly direction, on the extreme eastern edge. Also in sec. 36 there are a couple of rocky hills, one north and the other south of Middlegate Pass. Through the west central portion of the township is a range of mountains, running in a northerly and southerly direction, cut through in secs. 32 and 33 by Westgate pass. There is a considerable portion of the township included in this level or rolling land, the best being in secs. 34, 35 and 36, which is level enough and has a good enough soil to be cultivated; but is very dry and can not be successfully cultivated without irrigation. The water available for irrigation seems to be very limited . In sec. 36 there is a springy ravine, from which Mrs. L. Stephens gets water for her desert land claim, this is the only running water in this township.
