witnessed by pits on the NE. and NW. and a mound of earth on the N.

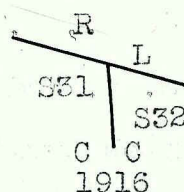
Latitude at this cor.  $41^{\circ} 27'$  N. Approximate longitude,  $119^{\circ} 05'$  W.

Thence.

North on a true line bet. secs. 31 and 32.

Over slightly rolling land, drainage W.

- 1.70 Wire fence, bears E. and W.
- 10.00 Enter meadow land, bears E. and W.; over meadow land with a gentle slope westward.
- 24.99 Intersect Fort McGarry Reservation boundary, 11.48 chs. S.  $72^{\circ} 10'$  E. of cor. No. 6, which is a basalt stone, 12 X 12 X 24 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.
- At the point of intersection I build a cor. as follows: Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for the closing cor. of secs. 31 and 32, with brass cap mkd.



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, S of cor.

Land, gently rolling on S. 10.00 chs., balance meadow with a gentle slope westward, drainage of line W.

Soil, S. 15.00 chs. loose dark brown clay loam soil, stony, 10 ins. deep, clay subsoil; balance of line has a deep rich dark loam, moist and medium texture, generally free from rock.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, rabbit brush, rye grass and wild
