
Note: A five chain steel tape and clinometer were used on all measurements of this work, the tape being frequently tested by comparison with a standard one chain steel tape kept for this purpose.

September 19, 1916.

Note: Iron posts were not always available throughout the survey of this Tp.; therefore, to avoid future delay in the work, stone corners were set, and in some instances, one and three inch posts instead of two inch posts.

I reestablish the cor. of Tps. 11 and 12 N., Rs. 49 and 50 E., which is a porphyry stone, 8x10x7 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, in its original position, as follows:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of Tps. 11 and 12 N., Rs. 49 and 50 E., with brass cap marked



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Dig pits, 24x24x12 ins., on each line, N., E., and W., 4 ft., and S. of post, 8 ft. dist.; and bury the old Tp. cor. stone alongside of iron post.
