

Resurvey and Survey of a portion of the
South Boundary of T.12 N., R.50 E.

Chains

clay loam of light texture, 26 ins. deep; no timber; medium undergrowth of sage brush, greasewood, shadscale and scattering grass on W. 30 chs.; medium undergrowth of rabbit brush, sage brush, greasewood, shadscale and scattering grass on E. 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ chs.; fair grazing on the mile.

East, resurveying bet. secs. 5 and 32.

Over level land, through medium undergrowth of rabbit brush, sage brush, shadscale, greasewood and scattering grass.

13.00 Leave level land; enter rolling hills and point of ascent, bears NW. and S.25°W.

Leave medium undergrowth of rabbit brush, bears NW. and SW.

30.00 Top of spur, 100 ft. above point of ascent, projects N., about 10 chs.

Thence nearly level.


35.00 Draw, drains N.20°W.

Ascend steeply.

Enter scattering growth of scrub cedars, bears N. and S.

40.00 After diligent search found no traces of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 10 ins. in the ground to solid rock, and erect a mound of stone, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, 16 ins. high, around post, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked



No suitable bearing trees available; raise a mound of stone, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.

Cor. stands 80 ft. above draw.

Note: From this $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., East, surveying instead of resurveying bet. secs. 5 and 32.

59.60 Top of ridge, 235 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., bears NE. and S. Descend.
