ical to survey same; therefore I abandon the survey of
the S. bdy. of the Tp. at this sec. cor.

North Boundary of T.12 N., R.50 E.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the N. bdy. of
the Tp., herein and after described, I survey East
East, bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over rolling hilly land, through scattering growth of
scrub cedars and medium undergrowth of sage brush and
scattering grass and greasewood.

East from cor. on near level line.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in
the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

Ascend steeply over mountainous land, bears N. and S.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 7 ins. in
the ground to solid rock, and erect a mound of stone,
3 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, around post for cor. of Tps.
12 and 13 N., Rs. 50 and 51 E., with brass cap marked
