Chains
37.10 Top of spur, 120 ft. above draw, projects N. 30° W.; desc. E. slope.

39.13 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 8 ins. in the ground to solid rock, with mound of stone, around, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.;

74.10 Draw, 130 ft. below spur, course NE.

79.13 The cor of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30.

Land, rolling mountainous, general drainage NE.

Soil, rocky heavy clay, very shallow, solid rock subsoil.

Scant growth of sage and bunchgrass.

No timber.

North on random line bet. secs. 19 and 20.

37.26 Intersect the N. bdy. at a point 3 lks. E. of the cor. of secs. 19, 20, 31 and 32.

Thence,

S. 0° 03' E. on true line bet. secs. 19 and 20.

Over rolling land.

9.30 Top of rolling ridge, bears N. 75° E. and S. 75° W.

31.00 Ravine, course N. 20° E.

37.26 The cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30.

Land, rolling mountainous, general drainage to NE.

Soil, rocky clay loam, 10 to 30 ins. deep, with rocky subsoil.

Scant growth of sage and bunch grass.

No timber.
