

General Description.

This fractional township lies on the west side of Win-nemucca lake; between the lake and a range of high mountains.

It consists of rolling land, with a general easterly slope.

The soil is dry, and ranges from a good quality, sandy loam to very rocky.

There are a number of small springs in sec. 3, and one larger, in sec. 10. These springs have been taken up by two settlers, A.J. Schell and W.R. Strong.

However there does not appear to be enough water to irrigate any very large tracts of land. Where water can be gotten upon the land, it produces abundantly, but is too dry to produce crops without irrigation.

The feed for grazing is rather poor, and consists of sagebrush, with a little grass and weeds.

There is no timber in this fractional tp., and no land in cultivation anywhere near.
