General Description.

The general character of the land throughout the township can be classed as a high, rough, rugged mountainous plateau surrounded with rimrocks, which rises abruptly to a height of 1000 ft. above the level land. Nearly all the fertile level <sup>land</sup> is along the four main water courses, namely, High Rock Creek, East branch of High Rock Creek, Mahogany Creek, and Yellow Rock Creek. All four water
