40.00	Found no trace of old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 5 and 32 after diligent search. I continue my retracement west.
80.00	Found no trace of old cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32 after diligent search. I continue my retracement west.
120.00	Found no trace of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 6 and 31 after diligent search. I continue my retracement west.
162.66	Intersect N. and S. line 5.78 chs. N. of the old cor. of Ts. 9 and 10 S., Rs. 61 and 62 E., hereinafter described. The bearing of these two miles is S. 87° 58' W., and the length is 162.76 chs.

Resurvey of the South Boundary of T. 9 S., R. 62 E.

The old cor. of Ts. 9 and 10 S., Rs. 62 and 63 E. is described by the surveyor general as a limestone 18x12x8 ins. I find it to be a granite stone 14x10x8 ins., marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. I remonument this cor. as follows:
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of Ts. 9 and 10 S., Rs. 62 and 63 E., with brass cap marked

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.

From the cor. of Ts. 9 and 10 S., Rs. 62 and 63 E., I resurvey N. 89° 35' W. on a true line along the south boundary of sec. 36.

Over rolling land draining W. to SW.
