the original surveys.

In all cases where a discrepancy was discovered between topography on the ground and the official records thereof a careful study of local conditions was made to ascertain if by shifting the corner position a point could be so located that distances therefrom to various topographic items would agree with the field notes, but no such points could be located.

Searches were made for corners, where they were found to be missing, at points where measurements and directions from important and unmistakable topographic items indicate them to be.

In the following report the topography is reported only on the lines on which an agreement was noted in the topography on the ground and the official notes, and which agreement serves to verify the authenticity of the existing and accepted corners.

The following is a list and description of the original corners found during the course of my examination.

T. 16 S., R. 56 E.

S.C. of T. 16 S., Rs. 56 & 57 E.

A limestone 10x7x6 ins.
above ground loosely set
in an earth and stone
mound, plainly marked VIW.
on E. VINSC on N. and VIE
on W. faces; not witnessed.

S.C. $\frac{1}{4}$ on S. bdy. sec. 36.

A sandstone 12x5x1 ins.
lying loose on an earth
and stone mound, scratched
 $\frac{1}{4}$ S C on one face; not wit-
nessed.

S.C. of secs. 35 & 36.

A limestone 9x6x4 ins.
loosely set in an earth
