

Chains

Note:- The SW. cors. of tracts 37 and 39 are identical with old cors. found upon the ground, which are decayed stakes, markings illegible, set in mounds of earth. Cardinal lines projected N., S., E. and W. from these old cors. practically coincide with the improvement lines of the adjacent tracts therefore they were adopted as control points for the survey of tracts 37 to 44 inclusive.

The location of tracts 45 to 49 inclusive is based wholly upon property lines as defined upon the ground by improvements and the survey of same was approved by the owners and claimants, Mr. Ira MacFarland and Mr. Franklin Eddy, who were present at the time of the survey.


Homestead 07488

The entry of Paul B. James of lots 1 and 2 and the S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  NE.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. 3, valid was not surveyed into a tract because there were no improvements or property lines on the ground and W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  and E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  NW.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 5 under the resurvey cover the original entry. Mr. James designated Mr. Ira MacFarland as his agent in all matters pertaining to lands claimed by him and MacFarland advised that insomuch as James had abandoned his holdings and had previously made no improvements that a tract survey of said claim was not necessary.

D.E. 09068, NW.  $\frac{1}{4}$  NE.  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 15, Alice Barber Kratka, valid is in conflict and is identical with Tract 47C. No tract survey was made because the claimant had abandoned her claim according to a statement from her son, Frank Kratka, living at Indian Springs. I wrote her at Thief River Falls, Minnesota relative to her entry, but received no reply.


