

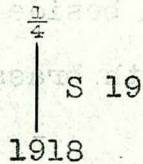

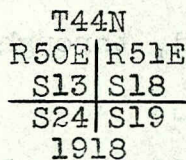
40.22 Proportionate measurement.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. for sec. 19, only, with brass cap mkd:



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, E. of cor.

80.44 The old cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, which is a piece of a decayed wooden post, 10 ins. long, 2 ins. square, marks almost invisible and lying on top of ly ground at the corner of a wire fence; but no evidence of accessories. Reestablish this cor. at the same point as follows: Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground beside the old stake at the cor. of wire fence, for cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, with brass cap mkd:



and dig pits, 18X18X12 ins., in each sec.,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  ft. dist. Land; rolling, S. 28.40 chs.; nearly level N. 52.04 chs. Soil; light, sandy loam about 6 ins. deep to a <sup>brown</sup> clay sub-soil about 18 ins. deep, lying on a rocky, light clay hardpan. Undergrowth; dense sagebrush. No timber. Fair growth of grass. Eastern exposure. Drainage NE.
