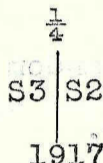
Top of spur, 340 ft. above sec. cor., projects E. Asc. gradual SE. slope

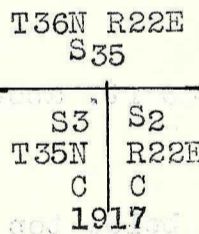
