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GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The west half and the southeast quarter of the township lies in the northeast part of Hualipi valley and the extreme west edge of the Blackrock Desert, respectively.

It is for the most part level, the only real exception being the southeast quarter, which is slightly broken by many low sand hummocks.
