

Independent Resurvey of the East Boundary of T. 19 N., R. 62 E.

Chains

from which

A pinon pine, 9 ins. dia., bears S. 39° E., 37 lks.

dist., marked T 19 N R 63 E S 31 B T.

A pinon pine, 8 ins. dia., bears S. 73° W., 101 lks.

dist., marked T 19 N R 62 E S 36 B T.

A mahogany, 8 ins. dia., bears N. 69° W., 101 lks.

dist., marked T 19 N R 62 E S 25 B T.

Cor. stands 70 ft. above wash.

Land, rolling hills. Limestone and quartzite formations.

Soil, gray gravelly stony loam. Heavy juniper and pinon pine timber. Undergrowth, sagebrush. Fair grazing.

From the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36

South, on a true line bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling hills, through heavy juniper, pinon pine, and mahogany timber. Ascend.

4.16 Fall 26 lks. W. of the old cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31, and 36, described by the surveyor general, which I destroy.

21.10 Top of ascent, 120 ft. above cor., descend.

38.70 Gulch, 30 ft. below top of ascent, drains E. Ascend.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 14 ins. in the ground to solid rock, in a mound of stone, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 B T.

Found no trace of old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

55.80 Top of spur, 240 ft. above gulch, projects N. 75° E.
