

Independent Resurvey of the East Boundary of T. 19 N., R. 62 E.

Chains

Descend.

68.30 Gulch, drains E. Continue to descend.

79.70 Main gulch, 200 ft. below top of spur, drains N. 85° E.

80.00 Found no trace of the old cor. of Ts. 18 and 19 N., Rs. 62 and 63 E.

Subsequent operations proving this to be the point for the cor. of Ts. 18 and 19 N., R. 62 E.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 1 and 36, Ts. 18 and 19 N., R. 62 E., with brass cap marked

Land, rolling foot hills. Limestone and quartzite formations. Soil; shallow, rocky, gray gravelly loam. Mahogany, juniper, and pinon pine timber. Undergrowth, sagebrush. Fair grazing.

Independent Resurvey of a portion of the South Boundary of T. 19 N., R. 63 E.

From the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 32, which was a limestone, 8x6x4 ins., loosely set in small mound of stone, marked ¼, which I remonument as follows:
