

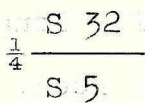

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, N. of cor.

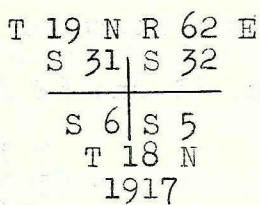
45.00 Top of ascent, 20 ft. above creek. Descend.

58.22 Fall 5.92 chs. N. of the old cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, which is a volcanic stone, 10x9x4 ins., set in a mound of stone, marked with 5 grooves on E., 1 groove on W. face, which I destroy.

58.80 Creek, 1 lk. wide, 1 in. deep, 40 ft. below top of ascent, drains N. 10° W. Ascend.

75.10 Top of spur 160 ft. above creek, projects N. 15° E. Descend.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, with brass cap marked



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor. Cor. stands 120 ft. below top of spur.
