Retracement of E. Bdy. of T. 28 N., R. 37 E.

From the old cor. of Tps. 27 and 28 N., Rs. 37 and 38 E., hereinafter described, I retrace N. on the E. boundary of T. 28 N., R. 37 E.

After searching diligently at intervals of 40 and 80 chs., I am unable to find any evidence of cor.^s, until at 473.28 fall 138 lks. W. of the old cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 N., Rs. 37 and 38 E., hereinafter described. As subdivisions in T. 28 N., R. 38 E. depend on every part of this bdy., I preserve the old alignment which has a bearing of N.0°10'E.; and by proportionate measurement the length of each half mile is 39.44 chs.

Resurvey of E. Boundary of T. 28 N., R. 37 E.

From the cor. of Tps. 27 and 28 N., R. 37 E., heretofore described, N. on a true line on the E. bdy. of T. 28 N., R. 37 E. on the E. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over low rolling mountainous land, through dense sagebrush; desc.

3.10 Bottom of draw, 20 ft. below Tp. cor., course S.60°E. 15 chs., thence SE.; asc.

9.53 Intersect the old cor. of Tps. 27 and 28 N., Rs. 37 and 38 E., which is a quartzite stone, 16x9x6 ins., lying in an old mound of stone, with no marks visible or any indications of accessories; but its place and position is verified from topography and retracements made along the S. and W. boundaries of T. 28 N., R. 38 E. I reestablish this cor. by setting at the same point the same stone, 10 ins. in the ground, and beside it an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of Tps. 27 and 28 N., R. 38 E., with brass cap marked:
