

## Survey of the West Bdy. of T. 23 N., R. 48 E.

Soil; dark and rocky, gravelly on surface, about 1 ft. deep to yellow clay hardpan on spurs; dark loam mixed with rock about 2 or 3 ft. deep to gravel or yellow clay hardpan in the bottom of draws and hollows.

Undergrowth; dense sagebrush, scattering short rabbit brush and tall service berry bushes.

No timber. Good grazing. Eastern exposure.

S. 43.50 chs. drains E.; N. 38.25 chs. drains NE.

Retracement of a Fraction of the S. Bdy. of T. 23 N., R.

From the closing corner of Tps. 22 and 23 N., R. 48 E., hereinafter described, I retrace E. on the S. bdy. of T. 23 N., R. 48 E., on the S. bdy. of sec. 31.

28.01 The old  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. which is an iron post, 1 in. diam., 12 ins. above ground, firmly set, properly marked and witnessed by a mound of stone N. of cor. bears S. 10 lks. dist. The bearing of this line is N. 89° 48' W., and the dist. is 28.01 chs.

I continue retracement E. on same line.

68.01 Fall 14 lks. N. of the old cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, which is an iron post, 3 ins. diam., 16 ins. above ground and surrounded by a mound of stone, firmly set, properly marked and witnessed by a mound of stone W. of cor. The bearing of this half mile is therefore N. 89° 57' W., and the dist. is 40.00 chs.
