## Subdivision of T. 23 N., R. 48 E.

Chs.

32.20 Top of spur, 60 ft. above bottom of hollow. At this point the spur forks; one fork projecting E. and the other NE.; desc.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap marked:

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor. This cor. is 70 ft. below top of spur.

52.40 Creek of clear water, 4 lks. wide 3 ins. deep, in the bottom of ravine, 220 ft. below  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., course N.80°E.; asc.

68.70 Top of spur, 130 ft. above creek, projects S.80°E. 10 chs.; desc.

73.70 Bottom of draw, 25 ft. below top of spur, course SE. 5 chs., thence E.; asc.

82.11 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, 120 ft. above bottom of draw.

Land; rolling mountainous with general drainage to the NE.

Soil; dark and rocky, gravelly on surface, about 1 ft. to 2 ft. deep to a subsoil of yellow clay or bed rock on spurs and ridges; dark loam with very little rock, 2 or 3 ft. deep in the bottom of draws and hollows.

Timber; a few scattering pinon pine.

Undergrowth; dense sagebrush, deer browse, scattering rabbit brush and service berry bushes.

Good growth of grass. Eastern exposure.

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., which is an iron post, 3 ins. diam., 16 ins. above ground, firmly set in a mound of stone, properly
