## General Description.

This township contains nearly every variety of land from level to mountainous. The soil throughout is of a light, sandy gravel loam, of medium texture to a depth of a few inches in the mountainous region, and to about two feet on the level sections. Throughout the whole country the land is covered with a dense growth of sage-brush and a fair growth of rich and nutritious grasses. Pine, cedar, juniper and mahogany timber is found all over the rolling mountainous and mountainous section. A high mountain ridge, named the East Humboldt Range, traverses through the township in a N. and S. direction very nearly through the center.
