a letter dated July 10th, 1917, to proceed as follows; From the SE. corner of T. 10 N., R. 30 E., run North on a blank line the record length of the West boundary of T. 10 N., R. 32 E., viz., 541.28 chs., thence West to an intersection with the East boundary of T. 11 N., R. 29 E., produced South from the corner of Ts. 11 and 12 N., Rs. 29 and 30 East, and at the intersection, set the Standard corner of Ts. 11 N., Rs. 29 and 30 E. Mr. Clark established this corner, and surveyed North therefrom, setting corners at intervals of 40 and 80 chs., on the East boundary of T. 11 N., R. 29 E. Mr. Clark was then assigned to Group 55, Nevada, and no other work was done on this Group, that season. These were the conditions on the ground at the time we were assigned to survey T. 11 N., R. 29 E. It was afterwards thought advisable to change the method of surveying this township, by moving the corner of Ts. 11 N., Rs. 29 and 30 E., 123.34 chs. East, so as to include the holdings of Mr. Beach, who is located in sec. 31, of T. 11 N., R. 30 E., and thereby obviate the necessity of surveying this township. These instructions are contained in a letter dated July 24th, 1917, from the U.S. Surveyor-General of Nevada.
