


Survey of the West boundary of T. 42 N., R. 39 E.

Chains


75.06 Spur, falls E., desc. NE. slope 45 ft. to,

 48.29 Leave timber, bears E. and W., desc. NE. slope 240 ft. to,
 65.00 Barb wire fence, bears E. and W.
 71.98 Stream, 12 lks. wide, 5 ins. deep, sandy bed, clear water, course E. asc. S. slope 40 ft. to,
 75.23 Spur, falls E., desc. NE. slope 22 ft. to,
 80.54 Intersect the south boundary of sec. 31, T. 43 N., R. 39 E., at a point, 2.01 chs. N. 89° 02' E., of the original cor. of Ts. 42 and 43 N., Rs. 38 and 39 E., which is a granite stone, 24x14x12 ins. in a mound of stone, marked, and witnessed as described by the surveyor-general.
