

Survey of the W.bdy.of T.44 N.,R.30 E.

Chains.

68.50 North Fork of Big Creek, 1 lk. wide, 2 ins. deep, clear water,
rock bottom, course E.

68.70 Branch of same creek, 2 lks. wide, 4 ins. deep, course E.

Both creeks fringed with scrub aspen timber. Thence over
E.slope.

70.70 Asc. 275 ft. over rocky S.slope.

80.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 15 ins. in the
ground to solid rock, with mound of stones around post,
for cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, with brass cap marked

Land, mountainous.

Soil, shallow sand and decomposed granite with granite

Undergrowth, sage and shadscale.

North, bet. secs. 1 and 6 on the W.bdy. of Tp.

Asc. 235 ft. over S.slope.

23.10 Ridge, bears E. and W. Desc. 300 ft. over N.slope.

27.50 Enter aspen, bears E. and W.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the
ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

47.30 Leave aspen, bears E. and W.

57.20 Draw, course W. Asc. 125 ft. over SW.slope.
