70.32 The old cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the N.bdy. of Tp., which is a granite stone, 10x8x6 ins. set in a mound of stone, and marked as described by the surveyor general. alongside of the stone, set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, with brass cap marked



raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.

Land, mountainous.
Soil, granite sand with much loose rock and many granite ledges.
Undergrowth, shadscale and sage.

Thence, North, on a random line bet. the first and second ranges of sections. At regular intervals of 40.00 and 80.00 chs., not finding any traces of the old cors.
set temp. ¼ and sec. cors.
480.94 Fall 7.40 chs. E. of the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the N.bdy. of Tp., heretofore described. I return to the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the S.bdy. of Tp., heretofore described.
Thence N. 0° 53' W., on a true line bet. secs. 35 and 36. Over nearly level land.
40.03 At proportional distance set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap marked
