GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

T.44 N., R.30 E. consists of the east slope of the Pine Forest range of mountains. It is a high range cut by deep canyons draining eastward to Quinn-River.

The soil ismostly a coarse, loose granite dand with many granite cliffs and some porphyry spurs. Along the streams the soil is a fine black alluvial of good depth and clay subsoil. There is no appreciable alkali except in the low-lands along the east edge of the township where the soil is a deep, fine sand with some adobe.

The streams are fringed with a scrub growth of aspen and willows. Away from the streams the undergrowth consists of sage and shadscale with a good growth of bunch grass where the slopes are too rocky for sheep to pasture.

The land is well watered and has numerous springs.

The Big Creek ranch, in secs. 23, 24, 25, 26, 35 and 36, owned by the Pacific Live Stock Co., is well improved with a house, barn, sheds, fences, orchard, garden, alfalfa field, etc.
