

Survey of the subdivision of T.45 N., R.30 E.

Chains.

- raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.
- 45.00 Desc. 365 ft. over NE. slope.
- 58.72 Gulch, course NE. Asc. 80 ft. over NW. slope.
- 64.00 Rocky ridge, bears NE. and SW. Desc. 30 ft. over SE. slope.
- 68.00 Same ridge bears NW. and SE. Desc. 35 ft. over NE. slope.
- 70.03 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 21 and 22, with brass cap marked

raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.
(This cor. is set South of the reestablished cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22.)

Thence bet. secs. 22 and 28.

Desc. 270 ft. over NE. slope.

80.18 The cor. of secs. 27 and 28.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, coarse granite sand and boulders, some cliffs.

Undergrowth, shadscale and sage.

Retracement and Resurvey of the subdivision of T.45 N., R.30 E.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the S. bdy. of Tp.,
described in Book on T.44 N., R.30 E.

Thence North, on retracement bet. secs. 35 and 36, 25 and 26,
23 and 24, 13 and 14, 11 and 12, and 1 and 2. Failing to
find any of the old cors. after diligent search, I set
temp. $\frac{1}{2}$ and sec. cors. at regular 40 and 80 chain points.

- 486.48 Intersect the Ninth Standard Parallel N. S. $88^{\circ}30'E.$, 15.01 chs.
dist. from the standard cor. secs. 35 and 36, which is an
iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., extending 12 ins. above
ground, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described
by the surveyor general. Make diligent search but find
no trace of the old cor. Set temp. cor. located as follows:
