54.50 Spur, slopes SE. Desc. 305 ft. over rocky NE. slope.

63.00 Gulch, course NE. Asc. 40 ft. over S. slope.

71.70 Spur, slopes NE. Desc. 335 ft. over N. slope.

84.60 Gulch, course NE. Asc. 50 ft. over S. slope.

87.85 Intersect the Ninth Standard Parallel N. 25.33 chs. W. of the
 standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. sec. 75, which is an iron post, 1 in.
 diam., extending 12 ins. above the ground and with a
 brass cap marked and witnessed as described by the
 surveyor general. At point of intersection set an iron
